Website announced hotel discounts to help visitors spend Christmas in London

Alongside the main event – the Choir of St. Paul's – is the Barbican Brass, filling Sir Christopher Wren's iconic dome with traditional seasonal music including Benjamin Britten's Ceremony of Carols and other Christmas songs. The service kicks off at 11.30pm, and continues on into Christmas morning.

So high is demand for a seat at the service, the cathedral puts on a number of other celebratory events throughout December to help visitors experience Christmas in London. Highlights of the season include La Nativite du Seigneur by Olivier Messiaen and a Christmas Carol Service on December 23rd.
