

The U.S. Marine Corps Join New International Military Show



LAS VEGAS, Feb. 28, 2011 -- 'The U.S. Marine Corps Air Ground Combat Center Band', Twentynine Palms, California, will join military and police talent in a new military tribute show - the '[Las Vegas International Tattoo](#)'. The showcase acknowledges the public support for the US Forces and will be hosted at the Thomas and Mack Center, April 15-16th.



Expect to see a fast-paced patriotic [Las Vegas show](#) - a wild ride with the 'Wicked Tinkers' and their powerful Celtic rhythms and breathtaking routines with bayonet-tipped 1903 Springfield rifles from the 'US Army Drill Team'. 500 performers will take part in this new event, joining the 'US Marine Corps' and bands from the US Navy and Air Force.

The tribute is part of a 'Celtic Festival' - a program of events drawing together cultural interests from Scotland, Ireland, Canada and the USA. The festival includes the Las Vegas Celtic Gathering and Highland Games which

Last Orders!

The original meaning of 'military tattoo' was a drum performance dating back from the 17th Century when the British Army was stationed in Belgium and the Netherlands. Drummers from the garrison would be sent out to towns to signal to soldiers, 'last orders', get back to barracks! The duty was known as doe den tap toe ("turn off the tap") - an instruction in old-dutch for innkeepers to stop serving beer. Over time this ceremony has become a much bigger spectacle involving military and civilian assets, choreographed into complete theatrical presentations.
