Siobhan Drane, Bupa's community affairs manager, deemed the week a great success:

"Communi-tea Week is a great way of highlighting the support networks that are available in local communities, as well as raising

awareness of the serious issues facing older people today. Everyone put on the kettle and contacted someone they thought may need their spirits lifting - a cup of tea is the perfect way to reach out and make a difference."

As well as organising tea-related social events, from tea-tasting sessions to tea dances, Bupa care homes urged others to help by inviting older people living on their own to join them for a cuppa, whether it be a neighbour or friend.
